# Dr. Lyn Sharratt

## PUTTING FACES ON THE DATA



IMPROVING EDUCATION BEGINS BY UNDERSTANDING THE NEEDS AND ABILITIES OF EVERY STUDENT.

QELi is delighted to welcome internationally renowned educator, Lyn Sharratt, Associate, Ontario Institute for Studies in Education, University of Toronto, to Brisbane and the Gold Coast for a special, one-day leadership event.

**Putting FACES on the Data** will examine how educators can collaboratively build the bridge from in-school data collection to improve instruction in the classroom. Student assessment data, including NAPLAN results, provide valuable beginnings and opportunities for rich conversations about what assessment and instructional strategies are needed for all students: those stuck, those struggling and those who need extending.

Lyn will discuss strategies from her book, '**Putting FACES on the Data**', along with findings from her work with Australian schools and systems, to explain how collectively, educators can develop a common language for whole-school sharing of students' progress and how ongoing.

Assessment can be used to successfully inform instruction.

### Lyn will unpack four key elements for success:

1. The importance of using the 14 Parameter Research when developing cultures of learning
2. How to use assessment data, such as deconstructing Learning Intentions and co-constructing Success Criteria, to inform instructional practices and Learning Walks and Talks as data today is instruction tomorrow
3. The intentionality of co-creating Data Walls to know every student; and
4. The power of the Case Management Meeting to increase student achievement and build teacher and leader capacity.

Do you know all your students and how each student is tracking in your classroom?

Have you put the FACES on the data in order to have cognitive insights and make emotional connections with each student?

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Lyn Sharratt is a highly-accomplished practitioner, researcher, author, and presenter. She coordinates the doctoral internship program in Leadership and Policy at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education, University of Toronto. Lyn has been a school superintendent, administrator, curriculum leader, and has taught all elementary grades and secondary-age students in inner-city and rural settings. She has analyzed and commented on public policy for a provincial trustee organization, the Ontario Public School Boards' Association; has taught pre-service education at York University; Masters' and Doctoral students at University of Toronto and Nipissing University; and led in-service Professional Learning in a provincial teachers' union head office.

Lyn is lead author of 'Realization: The Change Imperative for Increasing District-Wide Reform' (Corwin, 2009) and 'Putting FACES on the Data: What Great Leaders Do!'

with Michael Fullan (Corwin, 2012, published in English, Spanish and Arabic), as well as lead author of 'Good to Great to Innovate: Recalculating the Route K-12', (Corwin, 2015) with Gale Harild and 'Leading Collaborative Learning: Empowering Excellence' (Corwin, 2016) with Beate Planche. Corwin is now publishing her fifth book: CLARITY: What Matters MOST in Learning, Teaching and Leading. Sharratt, (Corwin, 2018).

Currently, Lyn is an advisor for International School Leadership with the Ontario Principals' Council, is an Author Consultant for Corwin Publishing and consults internationally, working with system, school and teacher leaders at all levels in Chile, Australia, the United States, the United Kingdom, and Canada to systematically increase all students' achievement by putting FACES on the data and taking intentional action.
